PADRES: PROTEJA LA AUDICION DE SUS HIJO - La música alta puede ser perjudicial para el oído. Tanto el nivel de ruido y la duración del tiempo de exposición al ruido pone uno en riesgo de pérdida de audición inducida por ruido, una condición que suele ser gradual, indolora y permanente. Pérdida permanente de la audición puede ocurrir a partir de escuchar 85 decibelios durante un período prolongado de tiempo. Sólo se tarda de 15 minutos de 100 decibelios (un nivel típico de los aparatos de MP3) para hacerse daño. La pérdida de audición en los jóvenes puede contribuir a las dificultades sociales. En un reciente informe de la Organización Mundial de la Salud, se observa que la pérdida de audición es una amenaza a 1.1 mil millones de adolescentes y adultos jóvenes en todo el mundo. Es causada principalmente por “uso inseguro de los aparatos de audio personales, y la exposición a niveles perjudiciales de sonido en clubes nocturnos ruidosos, bares y eventos deportivos.” Los padres pueden proteger la audición de sus hijos, haciéndolos conscientes de los riesgos asociados con auriculares. Pídales que usen tapones para los oídos en los conciertos ruidosos y eventos deportivos. Pueden descargar una aplicación de medidor de decibelios a sus teléfonos. Pídales que miden el volumen en sus auriculares; luego mantenerlo alrededor de 70 decibelios. Décadas de ahora dará sus frutos. ¡La prevención es la clave!

SOCIAL MINISTRY

One hundred thirteen clients came to the **HELPING HAND CRISIS MINISTRY OF SPICEWOOD** during April requesting food assistance for their 313 family members. Four of these clients were first-time visitors. Fifty-two families received financial assistance totaling \$10,083. Thirty-five percent of the financial assistance was to help with housing costs, fourteen percent for transportation and communication expenses with the remaining fifty-one percent for dental and medical expenses. The cost for food and personal hygiene products totaled \$2,236. Ministry operating expenses totaled \$541. Expenditures totaled \$12,860 and donations totaled \$13,875. At month's end, the Vista House and the Oak Hill RV were occupied by clients who would otherwise be homeless. May God continue to bless this ministry and all who make it possible.

PARENTS: PROTECT YOUR CHILD'S HEARING - Loud music can be damaging to hearing. Both level of noise and length of time exposed to noise put one at risk for noise induced hearing loss, a condition that is usually gradual, painless and permanent. Permanent hearing loss can occur from listening to 85 decibels for an extended period of time. It only takes 15 minutes of 100 decibels (a typical level for MP3 players) for damage to be done. Hearing loss in youth can contribute to social difficulties. In a recent World Health Organization report it is noted that hearing loss is a threat to 1.1 billion teens and young adults worldwide. It is mostly caused by "unsafe use of personal audio devices, and exposure to damaging levels of sound at noisy nightclubs, bars and sporting events." Parents can protect their children's hearing by making them aware of risks associated with earbuds. Have them wear earplugs at loud concerts and sporting events. They can download a decibel meter app to their smart phones. Have them measure the volume in their earbuds; then keep it around 70 decibels. Decades from now it will pay off. Prevention is the key word!!

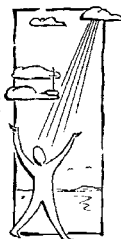

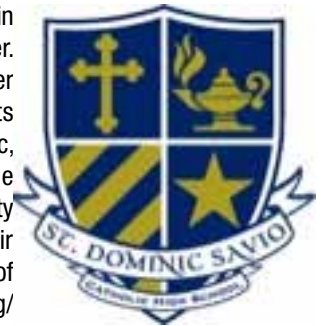
