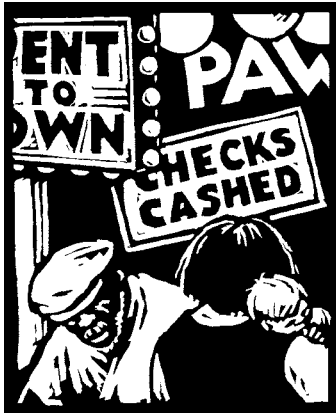

A NOTE FROM YOUR PARISH NURSES:

First Aid Kits!

Whether you are heading to the park or traveling across the country, it is important to keep a family First Aid Kit stocked with the basics for minor medical emergencies. That means going beyond band aids. Fill your First Aid Kit with everything from antibiotic cream to pain relievers, and you will be prepared with the safety essentials. Other items to include in your First Aid Kit are a flashlight, sunscreen, bug repellent, gauze, first aid tape, scissors, tweezers, alcohol swabs, hand sanitizer, soap, and an elastic bandage. Do not forget an EpiPen if anyone in your family has a history of life-threatening allergic reactions (anaphylaxis) to things such as bee stings, peanuts, or seafood. Of course, a First Aid Kit is just the beginning. Consider carrying a cell phone, a blanket, and a container of water in your car when traveling. And, do not forget to keep your emergency phone numbers handy. Hopefully, you will never need to use your First Aid Kit, but it is always good to be prepared.
