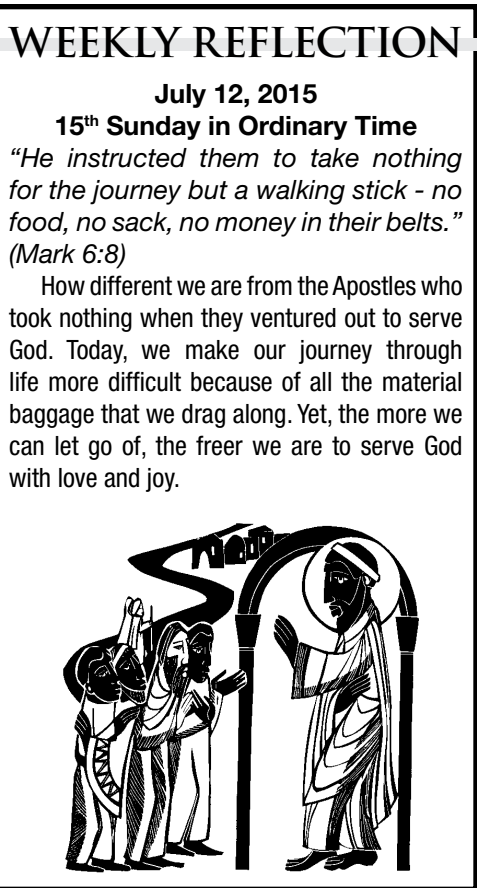

## SOCIAL MINISTRY

LTlov is offering another **FREE DENTAL CARE DAY** for Lake Travis eligible children ages 5-18 on Wednesday, **Aug. 12**. Registration forms are available in the narthex racks and the parish office. The application deadline is Aug. 10.

One hundred fifty-two clients came to the **HELPING HAND CRISIS MINISTRY OF SPICEWOOD** during June requesting food assistance for their 270 family members. Eight of these clients were first-time visitors. Fifty-two families received financial assistance totaling \$6,350. Twenty-two percent of the financial assistance was to help with housing costs, twenty-six percent for transportation and communication expenses with the remaining fifty-two percent for dental and medical expenses. The cost for food and personal hygiene products totaled \$2,921. Because of an annual payment for insurance, ministry operating expenses were higher than normal and totaled \$1,157. Expenditures totaled \$10,428 and donations totaled \$8,068. At month's end, the Oak Hill RV and the Vista House were occupied by clients who would otherwise be homeless. May God continue to bless this ministry and all who make it possible.



### A MESSAGE FROM YOUR PARISH NURSING MINISTRY

Summer is a perfect time to travel, spend long hours driving somewhere fun, staying cool in movie theaters, and just sitting around and enjoying good company. Keep some important things in mind, please!

When we sit for long periods of time or are inactive, blood flow in our extremities is interrupted and blood clots may form, primarily in our legs, or result in inflammation of the deep veins called deep vein thrombosis (DVT). There are other contributing factors that also may be present, some of which are genetic predisposition due to clotting factors. For the sake of our discussion, let's concentrate on not moving enough. Keep in mind that blood runs through our body like a mini highway, traveling to every part of us, and our body needs the roads to remain open. When blood is blocked in its journey, it may clot and impede flow causing various symptoms: swelling, pain, cramping, tingling, etc. A more serious condition may result when a blood clot breaks loose and travels to the lungs (pulmonary embolism), the heart, or the brain. If you have symptoms, contact your doctor.

**FOCUS ON PREVENTION!** When travelling, take frequent breaks... get up or out and walk around whenever possible. When sitting, pump your feet back and forth and all around to stimulate your circulation, bounce your legs, bend and straighten your knees, just keep moving. We all want to stay healthy this summer, so **MOVE IT!** Happy summer!
